



#### Workshop #1 (16/4, 11h-13h)

Objective: Creating a virtual participant poster to integrate in the meeting blog.

<u>Description:</u> Each group has to create each member poster with a personalized background photo using.

Resources: Computer – online app Canva.com; Adobe Premiere; Mobile phone – camera.

## Steps (not necessarily in this order):

- 1. Group creation (4 groups of 6 students): 1 coordinator, 1 photographer, 1 producer, 1 designer, 1 communicator, 1 reporter. Defining group name and roles.
- 2. Planning the work

- 4. Capturing pictures and videos
- 5. Editing pictures and videos
- 6. Producing posters
- 7. Presenting posters

### Workshop #2 (16/4, 14h-17h)

Objective: Creating a Photostory.

<u>Description:</u> Using a Movie Editor (Movie Maker or similar) create a photostory with characters explaining similarities between countries Flora and caption done back home by each country group. Try to explain some statements about similarities or differences that you have concluded.

## Workshop #3 (16/4, 14h-17h)

**Objective:** Preparing interviews

<u>Description:</u> Next day each group will have an opportunity to ask at maximum five questions to external biology experts in order to improve Photostory conclusions. This Workshop is to prepare each interview do each country expert.

<u>Resources:</u> Pictures and text created in previous task #1 and in Workshop #2. Computer/Laptop or tablet/mobile phone.

Objective: Data analysis and researching about sound pollution

For that use Google Spreadsheets or similar application, creating charts or tables with summaries. Use Google Documents to write at a report about sound pollution. Topics of the report: 1. School noise (using report created in Google Spreadsheets); 2. About noise pollution: ranges and consequences in school life; 3. Planning a noise reduction in school facilities.

Resources: Data retrieved in previous task #2. Computer/Laptop or tablet/mobile phone.

#### Workshop #5A (17/4, 11h-13h00m)

Objective: Modelling and printing a whistle

<u>Description:</u> Each group must choose or model a different whistle using Tinkercad and 3D printer. Before group work, there should be a lecture about 3D printing principles.
